This chapter offers a clear and valuable overview of contemporary initiatives shaping global governance for sustainable development, particularly around institutional reform, accountability, and multilateral coordination. One area that could further strengthen the chapter is a brief acknowledgment of operational and sector-level governance, where global commitments are translated into day-to-day implementation. In sectors such as drinking water and sanitation (SDG 6), governance challenges often relate less to the absence of international frameworks and more to capacity, regulatory implementation, and operational decision-making at the national and local levels. Recognizing capacity-building, training, and implementation tools as part of the governance ecosystem would complement the chapter's focus on macro-level reform. This perspective aligns with SDG 17 on means of implementation and with emerging discussions leading into the 2026 United Nations Water Conference, which emphasize acceleration and delivery. Incorporating this dimension would help present a more complete picture of how governance functions across scales, from global institutions to practical implementation.

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
