Flint: A Case Study in Crisis

In 2014, a source water switch in Flint caused corrosive water to damage lead service lines, allowing lead and other contaminants to enter the drinking water supply, leading to a widespread public health emergency. It devastated an already poverty-stricken city dealing with a variety of socioeconomic issues. The crisis led to:

- A large-scale public health emergency
- Extensive legal and financial consequences
- Criminal charges filed against several public officials

This live, online drinking water training provides an in-depth overview of the events leading to the Flint Water Crisis. Participants gain insights directly from the former Environmental Protection Agency Flint Emergency Coordinator.
