In 2014, a source water switch in Flint caused corrosive water to damage lead service lines, allowing lead and other contaminants to enter the drinking water supply, leading to a widespread public health emergency. It devastated an already poverty-stricken city dealing with a variety of socioeconomic issues. The crisis led to:

- A large-scale public health emergency
- Extensive legal and financial consequences
- Criminal charges filed against several public officials

Mission-Critical Capacity Building

This live, online drinking water training provides an in-depth overview of the key decisions, policies, and interventions implemented by federal, state, and local governments, along with partner organizations, to mitigate the Flint Water Crisis and support the city's recovery.
